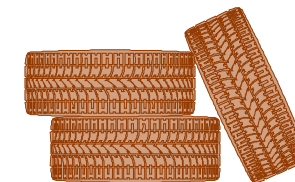

Chippewa County is once again sponsoring a Waste Tire Collection Program for all Chippewa County residents, businesses, and government agencies. This program provides an outlet for waste tires and assembles large amounts to be transported to facilities where the tires are converted to tire derived fuel (TDF).

Needles (insulin or syringes), thermometers, blood or infectious waste, blood glucose monitors, lancets and medications from local businesses.

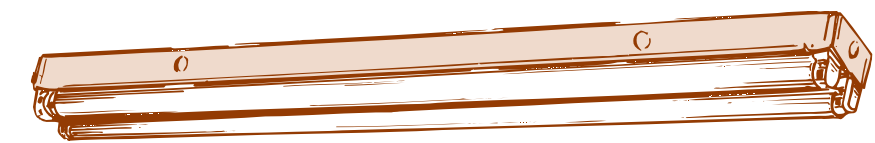

## Fluorescent Bulb Collection Program



Fluorescent light bulbs are an extremely cost effective and an energy efficient way to light your home or business. There is, however, one drawback; fluorescent bulbs contain mercury vapor. Mercury is a neurotoxin that when released into the environment contaminates our water and the aquatic food chain. This is what has caused the DNR to post fish consumption advisories on every lake in Wisconsin.

To prevent any more damage from being done, Chippewa County has teamed up with local hardware stores and recycling programs to provide a fluorescent bulb collection program. Residents and businesses can bring their used fluorescent bulbs to a convenient location, year round, for recycling at cost effective prices.

NOTE: The new low-mercury bulbs (or green-tipped bulbs) and compact fluorescent bulbs still contain mercury vapors and should be recycled. Landfills have banned ALL fluorescent bulbs.
