Value added is a measure of the industry's contribution to the local community; it includes wages, rents, interest, and profits. Direct impacts are jobs, revenue, and taxes for normal business operations. Indirect includes indirect and induced impacts. It refers to the dollars industry and households spend at other area businesses and the local jobs supported by the forest industry.
