

CHIPPEWA COUNTY TIMBER SALE TRACT 1-19

NORTH BRADLEY LAKE OAK

Located in Sec. 10 T32N - R8W Town of Sampson

Total Sale Area: (approximately 63 acres)

The table below contains an estimate of the amount of each species/product. There is no minimum bid for each species; however **the total minimum bid that is acceptable for Tract 1-19 is \$ 52,398.00.**

Please Note: **Bid prices for cordwood shall be listed in tons.** All cordwood weight conversion factors, as listed in the DNR Timber Sale Handbook (page 12-1), will be used.

Sale Area Description: (Please see the sale map on the back of this page)

The boundaries of this sale are marked with red and blue paint line. There is ~49 acres of oak shelter wood harvest to promote oak regeneration with an eventual overstory removal in the future once regeneration is established. There is also ~14 acres of selection harvest to promote oak, while maintaining at least 60 ft² of basal area within 100 feet of Bradley Lake.

Cutting Requirements:


Shelter wood area: Cut all trees except those marked with purple paint. All non-commercial trees (1 to 5 inch DBH), except oak saplings, must be cut concurrently with harvest. Do not cut sale boundary trees (red, or blue paint) or RMZ trees (yellow paint). Scarification by harvest operations is encouraged. **Do not cut or damage any pine or spruce.**

Thinning area: Cut only and all trees marked with orange paint including non-commercial trees marked with orange paint. Do not cut sale boundary trees (red, or blue paint) or RMZ trees (yellow paint). All aspen and birch are designated for harvest, within this area, and must be cut.

Special Conditions:

- **Oak Wilt and Wildlife Species Restrictions Apply: No harvest operations allowed between April 15 and August 10.**
- Wetlands (RMZ's) are delineated with yellow paint – no heavy equipment operation within the yellow paint lines.
- *Leave all snags (dead trees) unless they present a safety hazard. Use caution to limit the disturbance of Course Woody Debris (CWD) on the forest floor.* (ie) down logs greater than 12 inches in diameter.
- No harvesting activity will be allowed if rutting occurs.
- All hardwood logs, (except aspen) 10" or larger on the small end will be charged at the appropriate saw log stumpage rate.
- All slash must be lopped and scattered to lie within two feet of the ground. All slash and logging debris must remain within the sale boundaries and kept from wet lands, lakes and trails.
- The contract length is 2.5 years.
- The best truck access to the sale area is from 152nd Street (a/k/a Sand Lake Road) through private land. The Landowners have expressed willingness to provide access. The County will be responsible for securing access. Contractor will be responsible for maintenance and restoration of haul roads during and after harvest.
